## Course Goals and Objectives

Thanks to systematic attendance and active participation in the classes students will be able to:

- introduce themselves, talk about their family, studies and hobbies
- ask about different information: time, price, address, direction etc.
- communicate in a store, in a restaurant, at a railway station, in a library, etc.

- understand common inscriptions in urban space (signs, names of institutions and stores) and simple texts (forms, timetables, menus, cultural programs, different announcements etc.)

- discover the most important Polish holidays, traditions and customs
- get to know the most famous Polish writers and artists and their work
- discover the highlights of Polish history and the most important Polish monuments
- and tourist attractions
- understand contemporary Polish society.

# Course Description, Methods, and Materials

An intensive course of basic level Polish, focused on a practical use of the language in common everyday life situations (Survival Polish) and introduction to Polish culture, history and contemporary society.

Methods:

- Introducing vocabulary and useful phrases. Different types of vocabulary exercises.

- Working on authentic Polish texts and materials (menus, timetables, forms, leaflets etc.)

- Listening to short dialogues.
- Listening to songs.
- Watching films and fragments of films.
- Speaking exercises in pairs and groups (scenes from everyday life, simple conversations, for example about hobbies or studies).
- Language games.

- Short lectures and PowerPoint presentations in English about the most important aspects of Polish culture, history and contemporary society.
- Trivia about Poland in English.
- Group projects in English on Poland-related topics.

#### Assignments, Grading Criteria, Prerequisite Subject

- Language test (basic vocabulary and phrases) 30%,
- Multiple choice test in English on Polish culture, history and contemporary society 30%,
- Group project on a chosen Poland-related topic 40% (10-minute presentation in English on a topic dealing with some aspect of Polish culture, history etc., based on students' interests/hobbies.)

# Notice To Students

The course is designed for students planning to study at one of Polish universities in order to prepare them to their stay in Poland and to let them avoid any possible cultural shock or difficulties related with language barrier.
