This course will introduce basic knowledge of characteristic features of Korea and fundamental communication skills of spoken and written Korean. It is expected to enhance students' understandings of the traditional and contemporary Korean culture.</p> <p>▷ <b>Objectives: Students of this course will be able to</b></p> <p>(1) achieve basic level of communicative skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking in Korean.</p> <p>(2) acquire fundamental knowledge of basic structure and patterns of the language.</p> <p>(3) become familiar with various aspects of Korean society and culture through the language.</p>
